LEWY BODY DEMENTIA IS...

A progressive brain disease and the second most common cause of neurodegenerative dementia after Alzheimer's Disease. Patients with LBD have similar problems to those with Parkinson's disease with dementia (PDD), which is also a Lewy body disorder.



LBD IS NOT A RARE DISEASE...

LBD accounts for approximately 20% of dementia cases in the United States, which means there are an estimated 1.5 million cases of LBD in the U.S.

EARLY AND ACCURATE DIAGNOSIS IS IMPORTANT BECAUSE...

Antipsychotic drugs may cause extreme adverse reactions in those with LBD. Cholinesterase inhibitors may improve alertness and cognition and potentially reduce hallucinations and behavioral symptoms. With only 30-50% of LBD cases being accurately diagnosed, even in dementia centers, it is crucial to receive an early and accurate diagnosis to ensure the best treatment and care. Individuals who have LBD are often misdiagnosed with Alzheimer's disease if a memory disorder is present or Parkinson's disease if movement problems are present.
